Logic Control Intro Assignment

For those of you who are a little unsure:

- should be an introduction in two paragraphs about the Logic Control concept
 - this may include information about PLC and fuzzy Logic – if you feel it is relevant
 - back up some of your statements with sources you find (other than Göran's literature)

Reason for doing this task:

- learning outcomes
 - Selecting key information from relevant sources
 - Process leading up to writing an introduction
 - Summarizing information in your own words
- Sets you up for your project and report writing
- individual writing task to get you started in the communication of the topic in English
- prepare you for the introduction you will need for your report (which will likely be a combination of your groups' intros)

Presentation Instructions

- In groups of 4 (2 sets of project pairs)
- What should be included:
 - summary of the contents of the sources
 - motivation why these sources selected
 - where sources come from, what's their context?
- Each person makes a 3-min speech
 - after each, ask any necessary follow up questions
 - after all presentations, discuss:
 1. the sources
 2. what the presenters did well and also what can be improved for next time

Learning outcomes for report assignment

- Encountered, collected and selected a set of scientific and popular science texts and articles related to your theme and your field of study
- Reflected on strategies for choosing information from a text and selecting information
- Produced a text that is coherent and logical in its organization, with emphasis on clear paragraphing as well as accurate sentence structure and grammar, and academic in style
- Expressed the topic by relevant vocabulary and in an accurate and effective way
- Practiced a process-oriented approach to writing that involves producing a series of versions of the text, including receiving and implementing constructive feedback, as well as reviewing and commenting similar texts produced by peers.
- Have a deeper understanding of the report/article writing process.

Report Assignment

- **Mini-report** in English of your LET085 project
- **1500 words +/-10%**
- Pairs (your project pairings)
- Process writing assignment:
 - Step 1: drafting
 - Step 2: peer response on draft
 - Step 3: finalising

NOTE:

- This report is not particularly long in comparison to your Swedish report.
- Keep this in mind as you write
 - it is **not a translation**
 - it is **more of a summary but should still contain the parts of a report.**

Report Details and Structure

- **Final hand-in: 19th May, 2015**
- ***Draft hand-in: 4th May**

The English report should be a short version of the Swedish LET085 report, but should still include the following:

- **Title page** with your names, course, university and date
- **(Abstract not necessary)**
- **Introduction** with problem description / questions
- **Main body** with **sub-chapters**, **in-text references** to research sources where needed, **images** (tables/ charts /illustrations) where appropriate
- **Conclusion** where you sum up your findings and return to your questions
- List of **references** (according to the IEEE referencing system. See Chalmers Library http://guides.lib.chalmers.se/IEEE_guide)

For all other requirements, like font size, etc, see Schedule/Course overview document

Introduction

Should include the follow:

1. Background
2. Motivation
3. Purpose
4. Scope
5. Structure/Outline

Sets audience expectations; gives text direction:

“The goal/aim/purpose of this report/article/paper/research is to...”

Main body: text after headings

- Section heading + text that *introduces* the coming section:
 - Sets context
 - Ties back to purpose
 - Outlines section
- Always include text after a heading!

In main body:

- previous research (if relevant), methods, materials, results, discussion

Conclusion

- Should synthesize results/discussion with introduction
→ What can we conclude from the results and connect back to your purpose?
- Could also point to future work

Draft Stage

Learning outcome:
