
- Unique task/scope

Scrum

- “Scrum is a framework for developing, delivering and sustaining complex products”.
- Scrum is built on Empirical process control theory
 - What could that mean?

SCRUM FRAMEWORK




Scrum teams

- Scrum teams are cross-functional
 - What does that mean?
 - No other parts of the company takes care of testing/documentation or such.

Scrum roles

- Team (3-9 members)
- Scrum master (servant-leader!)
- Product owner

Scrum pillars



- **Transparency**
 - You can see what is going on: artifacts and processes.
- **Inspection**
 - You do look at what is going on: artifacts and processes.
- **Adaptation**
 - You adjust to achieve higher efficacy.
 - Efficacy = the ability to produce a desired or intended result.
